The 2007 CPNP Annual Meeting at The Broadmoor in Colorado Springs, April 15-18, promises to be a most stimulating and festive celebration of CPNP's 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The overall theme is **Brain Discovery and Translation: A Decade of CPNP**. In line with the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary focus and a desire to incorporate components addressing both history and the future, we are extremely fortunate to have Dr. Ross Baldessarini presenting our opening keynote – *Psychiatry and Psychopharmacology: Advances and Challenges* – and Dr. Larry Ereshefsky closing out our program with a look into the future, specifically with respect to new paradigms for the treatment of schizophrenia and Alzheimer's disease.

Traditions will be maintained – such as a pre-meeting workshop on Neuropsychological Assessment, roundtables to accommodate individual interests and networking, and poster presentations. New this year will be an increase in the hours of recertification programming offered, some of which will now be integrated into the general programming, as well as an increase in the home-study literature based recertification activities. In addition to programming revolving around major psychiatric disorders and their treatments, presentations are included in the areas of nutrition, exercise, sleep, and hormones, as well as forensic psychiatry, metabolic disorders, and traumatic brain injury. A joint session with ASCP addressing Aging with a Developmental Disability is planned as part of our continuing concurrent track programming.

### Educational Goals and Specific Learning Objectives

- Relate the cognitive domains evaluated by neuropsychological tests to functional areas of the brain and functional ability.
- Evaluate the treatment options for maintenance therapy of bipolar disorder.
- Identify medical target symptoms, factors affecting epidemiology, and treatments of various eating disorders.
- Discuss the pathophysiology, medication management, and monitoring outcomes of obsessive-compulsive disorder.
- Identify treatment resistant schizophrenia, strategies for assessing clinical response, and pharmacological management.
- Describe the evolution of psychiatric diagnosis/treatment and the major developments of clinical psychopharmacology over the past decade.
- Discuss the importance of nutrition, exercise, and sleep on brain functioning and the impact of substance abuse and hormone changes on psychiatric disorders.
- Explain how traumatic brain injury impacts cholinergic and noradrenergic functioning and why specific treatment strategies may be helpful.
- Define assessment techniques, pharmacotherapy options, non-pharmacologic interventions, and monitoring parameters for various sleep disorders.
- Explain the differences in pharmacology, pharmacokinetics, and dosing of prescription, non-prescription, and investigational drugs for insomnia.
- Identify, assess, and recommend treatment for the most common chronic medical, neurologic, and psychiatric conditions in the aging mentally retarded and developmentally disabled patient.
- Describe forensic psychiatry practice including common practice areas, definitions of common terms, the role of the pharmacist, and the components of medication therapy management.
- Compare and contrast forensic interviewing and expert testimony techniques with a standard mental status exam.
- Develop optimal treatment plans in managing diabetes and hypertension to reduce the risk of cardiovascular events.
- Compare and contrast novel, future therapies of schizophrenia and Alzheimer's disease.

This half-day, neuropsychological assessment workshop will improve attendees' understanding of various neuropsychological tests used in research and clinical practice. Goals of the workshop include identifying the domains of functional disability in serious mental illness and the different cognitive ability areas measured by neuropsychological (NP) tests. Additionally, goals include describing potential brain-behavior relationships in performance on NP tests from the perspectives of lesion studies, neurodegenerative conditions, and functional neuroimaging and examining the interpretation of performance on these measures. 
