On behalf of the Recertification and Program Committees, I am happy to announce the 2012 CPNP Annual Meeting, *Making Waves in Neuropsychiatric Pharmacy*, to be held April 29-May 2 in Tampa, Florida. Other sessions delivered by practitioners in the field include *Finding Common Ground Across the Psychosis Spectrum* presented by Roy Perlis, MD, MSc, *Personalized Medicine in Depression* presented by Madhukar Trivedi, MD and *Drugs in Development: Treating the Core Social and Communication Impairments in Autism* by Craig Erickson, MD.

Concurrent programming throughout the meeting will provide sessions on issues of the day, neurologic disorders and two research tracks, one featuring award candidate platform presentations and the second featuring a two-hour session on *Pharmacogenomics*.

Given their popularity last year, CPNP will once again feature *Networking Roundtables* and a *Clinical Pearls* session that will provide the participants with practical tips that can be immediately applied in everyday practice.

The transformation theme closes out the Annual Meeting on Wednesday morning with a thought-provoking call to action by Steve Leifman, JD, on the topic of *Mental Illness in the Criminal Justice System*. Judge Leifman will explain the vast criminalization of the mentally ill and the role of pharmacists and other healthcare professionals in influencing the future of the mental health system.

GOALS, PRACTICE GAPS & LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The CPNP Annual Meeting has been designed to bridge the perceived “practice gap” between current knowledge and practice in a number of areas of neuropsychiatry. Literature has shown that approximately one-third of patients treated with antidepressants fail to have an adequate treatment response despite multiple trials of antidepressant agents. As the field of pharmacogenomics progresses, it is clear that certain genetic and biologic markers may help to predict antidepressant response. Learning about these markers and how to apply them to practice, clinicians will be better able to tailor therapy for specific patients in the future.

Another area that the CPNP Annual Meeting will address is the management of antipsychotic-related adverse effects. With the advent of the second generation antipsychotic medications, many

younger clinicians have not been adequately exposed to movement disorders, resulting in under-diagnosis and an increase in morbidity associated with antipsychotic use. The detection of movement disorders using various rating scales will be addressed during this meeting so that practitioners are more familiar with how to diagnose and treat these conditions.

Aside from movement disorders, it is well established that second generation antipsychotic medication use is associated with an increased risk of metabolic syndrome and ultimately an increased risk of cardiovascular comorbidities. This meeting will also address the management of these conditions, which will serve as a platform to bridge the gap between primary care and psychiatric care.

Overall learning objectives for the Annual Meeting include:

- Discuss the expectations payers have for medication management services and classify your service in terms that the private sector understands.
- Examine current controversies regarding the use of antidepressants in depressive disorders.
- Differentiate contemporary bariatric surgical procedures and their implications on absorption pharmacokinetics.
- Analyze the normal function of nicotine and nicotinic receptors related to thought processes and recommend a plan of action for patients with schizophrenia who smoke tobacco.
- Identify leadership strategies to enhance goal accomplishment and personal effectiveness.
- Review recent findings from genetic and family studies of schizophrenia and bipolar disorder and discuss the implications these have for the course and treatment of these disorders.
- Compare and contrast the primary drug-induced movement disorders, their etiologies, and associated medications.
- Apply appropriate risk assessment strategies for the abuse, misuse, and diversion of opioid therapies used in the management of chronic pain.
- Discuss current and future research regarding the use of neuroimaging as well as the genetic and biological markers used in developing a personalized medication approach for the treatment of depression.
- Discuss the pharmacological strategies targeting social and communication impairments in autism and the current clinical trials assessing their safety and efficacy.
- Interpret recommendations from the yet to be released NCEP and JNC guidelines and identify strategies to achieve optimal outcomes in patients with metabolic syndrome and mental illness.
- Examine the U.S. Headache Consortium’s evidence-based migraine treatment guidelines and review new medications and devices that have either recently received FDA approval or are expected to receive FDA approval for migraine treatment.
- Recognize guidelines for the psychopharmacologic treatment of neuropsychiatric sequelae of traumatic brain injury.
- Describe current approaches to testing, interpretation of results, and how research should be used to establish clinical utility of pharmacogenomics tests in psychiatry.
- Review the “deinstitutionalization” of psychiatric facilities and how it has led to the criminalization of mental illness.
- Explore data on the use of cannabis to treat various medical disorders, the process for legally obtaining medical marijuana, and the restrictions associated with its use.

The controversies surrounding the use of antidepressants in the treatment of depressive disorders have rocked the world of psychiatry. From black box warnings to heated debates about efficacy in leading medical journals, this topic is sure to be timely and thought-provoking. S. Nassir Ghaemi, MD, MPH, will discuss the efficacy of antidepressant therapy, differentiate treatment strategies and contrast current controversies in the use of antidepressants. Dr. Ghaemi is a world-renowned leader in the treatment of mood disorders and author of *A First-Rate Madness: Uncovering the Links Between Leadership and Mental Illness*. Finding Common Ground Across the Psychosis Spectrum

In the past, schizophrenia and bipolar disorder have been classified as two separate diagnoses in the practice of psychiatry. However, several recent findings have called into question whether these disorders are etiologically distinct. During this presentation, Roy Perlis, MD, MSc, will discuss recent findings in genetic studies of schizophrenia and bipolar disorder, as well as examine their implications on diagnostic tools and treatment. Plan to attend this session to gain insight into the future role of genetics in psychiatry.



Personalized Medicine in Depression

Madhukar Trivedi, MD, Director, Mood Disorders Research Program and Clinic, Professor, UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas, Dallas, TX

Though depression is one of the most prevalent mental illnesses that psychiatric practitioners will face, response to treatment is variable and largely unpredictable. During this session, Madhukar Trivedi, MD, will identify characteristics which may predict treatment response. He will also highlight ways to "personalize" the treatment of depression to an individual. Lastly, Dr. Trivedi will highlight current and future research that focuses on identifying specific predictors of treatment response, such as biomarkers, genes and neuroimaging.
